The Moderator reviewed the minutes of the September 10, 2018 Presbytery meeting. There was a motion to approve these minutes. The motion was approved.

Presbyter for Community Life: John Odom, Presbyter for Community Life, gave his report. He talked about the recent hate crime shootings at a Louisville Kroger and noted that there will be a forum hosted by the Louisville Metro Police Department for the purpose of training congregations about church safety. This workshop will be held on November 8 at the LMPD Training Facility on Taylor Blvd. in Louisville.

John invited pastors and congregations to participate in the pulpit exchange on February 17, 2019.

John shared plans for a "Lunch and Learn" with David Gambrell, who will share about a wonderful resource-- the *Book of Common Worship*. The Lunch and Learn will be held at the Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary on January 29, 2019 at noon.

Commission on Ministry: Cynthia Campbell, Chair, reported on the work of the Commission on Ministry. She pointed the Presbytery to the written report listing the various actions taken by the COM since the last Presbytery meeting. Cynthia also called the Presbytery to note that the COM will very likely request a called Presbytery meeting on November 28, 2018 at 4pm at Highland Presbyterian Church for the purpose of examining three Candidates for Ministry.

Rev. Campbell called on Rev. Brenson Bishop to be recognized for honorable retirement from ministry. Bren had served in the Mid-Kentucky Presbytery and worked most recently as a chaplain in the Veterans' Administration. He also served the United States of America as a soldier in the military. Rev. Al Earley offered a prayer for Bren, his family and his ministry in retirement.

Summary of actions taken by the Commission on Ministry since the last meeting of the presbytery --

FOR INFORMATION:

- The Commission approved the transfer of the Rev. Evan "Charlie" Evans from the Presbytery of Western Kentucky to serve as temporary pastor at First Presbyterian Church in Glasgow, KY effective November 11, 2018.
- The Commission approved the transfer of the Rev. Rob Warren to Transylvania Presbytery.

- The Commission approved the transfer of the Rev. John Roper to Grace Presbytery.
- The Commission approved the appointment of the Rev. Candi Cubbage as moderator of session for Buechel Presbyterian Church.
- The Commission approved the appointment of the Rev. Gary Torrens as moderator of session for Crescent Hill Presbyterian Church.
- The Commission approved the renewal of the contract between the Rev. Carlos Malave and Meadowview Presbyterian Church, effective November 1, 2018.
- The Commission has received the contract renewal between the Rev. Marissa Galvan-Valle and Beechmont Presbyterian Church and will act on it at its November 5 meeting.

Coordinating Commission: Carole Pye, Chair, reported. She invited the Stated Clerk, Jerry Van Marter, to review a proposed change to the Presbytery's policy on electing Commissioners to the General Assembly. There was discussion about the use of the form. The motion was approved. (attached)

Carol shared a first reading of proposed changes to standing rules 7.8 and 7.9 to combine the Committees on Nominations and Representation into a single Committee on Nominations and Representation. She also shared a first reading of proposed changes to 7.10.5 regarding the purpose, composition and responsibilities of the Committee on Christian Education, including oversight of UKirk ministries in the presbytery.

It was noted that the Standing Rules will be edited to include more detail regarding the duties of the Committee on Representation.

- **1.** <u>First Reading:</u> Proposed changes to Standing Rules 7.8 and 7.9 to combine the Committees on Nominations and Representation into a single Committee on Nominations and Representation
 - That the Standing Committee on Nominations and the Committee on Representation be combined into one committee: the Standing Committee on Nominations and Representation.
 - That the responsibilities of the Committee on Representation be assigned to the new Standing Committee on Nominations and Representation.
 - Amend the Standing Rules 7.8 and 7.9 so they reflect these changes. They will now read (new material in red; material to be deleted struck-through):

7.8 Standing Committee on Nominations and Representation (reports directly to the presbytery) — Composed of nine members, as evenly divided between ministers and ruling elders as possible. The members shall be nominated by the Coordinating Commission and elected by the presbytery. The Coordinating Commission shall endeavor to assure that the membership of the committee represents the diversity priorities of the presbytery.

7.8.1 Responsibilities:

7.8.1.a Shall nominate to presbytery all general officers, committee members and their chairpersons, Coordinating Commission members and its chairperson, Cedar Ridge Camp, Inc. Board of Directors, and commissioners for other governing bodies of the church. The list of nominees shall ordinarily be submitted to the presbytery at the November stated meeting.

- 7.8.1.b Shall initiate and maintain a personnel file of all ministers and ruling elders of the presbytery and qualified active members to serve as a "personnel resource pool" from which committees may create task groups.
- 7.8.1.c Shall endeavor to nominate for membership a balanced number of ministers and ruling elders for all commissions and committees of the presbytery.
- 7.9 Committee on Representation (reports directly to the presbytery) Shall be composed of six members in accordance with the Book of Order G-8.1.

7.9.1 Responsibilities:

7.9.1.a 7.8.1.d Shall advise the presbytery 's Committee on Nominations of any need for nominations in particular categories needing increased representation.

7.9.1.b 7.8.1.e Shall regularly inform the presbytery of its progress toward fair representation of diverse categories.

7.9.1.c Shall meet at least twice once a year with the Committee on Nominations.

RATIONALE: In the presbytery's annual report to the Synod of Living Waters, it is continually noted that Book of Order-mandated standards for representation are exceeded by Mid-Kentucky Presbytery. Our Nominations Committee clearly is doing a stellar job of fulfilling its representational responsibilities without a Committee on Representation, which has been inactive in recent years. The presbytery's restructuring in 2015 was intended to simplify the structure of the presbytery so that the people resources of the presbytery can be more effectively deployed. By combining these two committees, six presbyters will be freed up for service in crucial areas of the presbytery's ministry and mission. The new Form of Government (3.0103), while stating a preference for a standalone Committee on Representation, permits the combining of the Committee on Representation with another committee as proposed in these changes.

2. <u>First Reading:</u> Proposed change to Standing Rule 7.10.5 to clarify the purpose, composition and responsibilities of the Committee on Christian Education, specifically the responsibility for the oversight of UKirk ministries of the presbytery (new material in red; material to be deleted struck-through) –

7.10.5 Committee on Christian Education whose purpose will be to continue and grow educational opportunities in Mid-Kentucky Presbytery. This committee will be composed of two-three members elected by presbytery, one of whom will serve as chair, and may add to its membership by invitation members of a-congregations of the presbytery.

The Committee on Christian Education will also be responsible for the oversight of UKirk ministries in the presbytery through the UKirk Board. On behalf of the presbytery, the UKirk Board will call, supervise and encourage the work of UKirk staff. With one member of the Personnel Committee, the UKirk Board will conduct an annual review of UKirk staff.

Finance Committee: Don Garton, Chair of the Finance Committee reported. On behalf of the Finance Committee, Don moved approval of a ten-year first right of refusal contract between the Kentucky Derby Festival and Central Presbyterian Church. There was discussion. It was mentioned that the Kentucky Derby Festival uses the Central Presbyterian congregation's parking lot and donates funds to the church. The motion was approved.

On behalf of the Finance Committee, Don moved the 2019 Presbytery Budget. There was discussion. The motion was approved. (attached)

There was a time of announcements.

Ben Blake, Vice-Moderator, took the chair.

- Included in the packet for this meeting is a letter from Mission Responsibility Through Investment Committee (MRTI) about the General Assembly's action on fossil fuel divestment. We received the letter because we concurred with the overture to GA223 on fossil fuel divestment.
- The Office of the General Assembly has sent out the proposed amendments to the Constitution approved by the 223rd General Assembly:
 http://www.pcusa.org/site media/media/uploads/oga/pdf/ga223 proposed amendments to the constitution2018.pdf.
 Our standing rules call for the Church Administration Committee to review the amendments and make recommendations to the presbytery. Those recommendations will come to the presbytery in February for a first reading and to the May meeting for the presbytery's votes. The deadline to report our votes is June 23, 2019.
- The presbytery has received an invitation from the Preston Highway Ministry and Beechmont Presbyterian Church to host the November 16, 2019 meeting of the presbytery at Beechmont Presbyterian Church. The presbytery is still entertaining invitations for churches who wish to host the May 20 and September 23, 2019 meetings of the presbytery.

Jerry reported that the three Presbyteries collected an offering of \$1,588.47 to be set aside for the Kentucky Council of Churches. He reported that attendance for the presbytery meeting included 48 Teaching Elders and 21 Ruling Elders

On behalf of the Presbytery of Mid-Kentucky, Jerry thanked the Presbyterian Church of Danville for their hospitality in hosting the Tri-Presbytery meeting.

Jerry also thanked those who had asked about his health as he was in the hospital. He told the Presbytery that he is getting better every day.

There was no new business.

On behalf of the Presbytery, Ben Blake thanked the Moderator, Wayne A. Steele, Sr. for his service as Moderator.

The Moderator took the chair.

Process for Electing Commissioners to General Assembly Presbytery of Mid-Kentucky Effective November 3, 2018

The Committee on Nominations will select one Minister of Word and Sacrament and one Ruling Elder for election by the Presbytery of Mid-Kentucky to serve as the presbytery's commissioners to the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Election will take place at the November meeting of the presbytery the year before the General Assembly meets (November 2019 for the 2020 General Assembly).

Ministers and Ruling Elders interested in serving as commissioners must apply to serve. The Committee on Nominations will select one minister and one ruling elder for election by the presbytery from among those who apply. The Commission on Nominations will determine deadlines for applications.

Ministers and Ruling Elders who wish to serve as commissioners must be active in their congregation and in the Presbytery of Mid-Kentucky. Experience serving at the Synod and General Assembly levels of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) is also desirable. Years of ordained service and years of service in the Presbytery of Mid-Kentucky will be taken into consideration but will not be determinative in the selection process.

Service as a General Assembly commissioner is rigorous, requiring many hours of preparation and orientation prior to the General Assembly, long hours of service during the meeting of the General Assembly, and a commitment to interpret the work of the General Assembly to the presbytery and its congregations (upon request) after the General Assembly. Those wishing to serve should take these responsibilities into consideration when applying.

Note: the 224th General Assembly meets in Baltimore, MD, June 20-27, 2018.
